Officer Timothy Joe Lindsey – Conservation Enforcement Officer of the Year

Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (ADCNR) Enforcement Officer Timothy Joe Lindsey was awarded Conservation Enforcement Officer of the Year at the 2007 Governor’s Conservation Achievement Awards banquet held by The Alabama Wildlife Federation (AWF) on Friday, August 3, 2007 at the Embassy Suites in Montgomery.

Lindsey is a four-year veteran of the ADCNR Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries (WFF) Division and excels in his professional capacity as a Conservation Enforcement Officer in Madison County in District I. His efforts are focused on violators who represent the greatest danger to the public and who do the most damage to natural resources. Lindsey has an outstanding record of apprehending dangerous violators and is always prepared for trial, with any relevant evidence needed to try a case. His knowledge of the outdoors and desire to promote the highest ethics regarding the wildlife and fisheries of Alabama are equally impressive. Additionally, he is actively involved in organizing events aimed at getting children outdoors including introducing youth to fishing.

WFF Law Enforcement Chief Allan Andress describes Lindsey as a conscientious and exemplary officer. “Joe is one of our finest young officers and does an outstanding job,” Andress said. “We are proud to have him represent the Department with his professionalism and commitment.”
